GERMAN MINOR FOR ICP STUDENTS

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The minor in German Studies consists of 30 credit hours. ICP students have the option of obtaining a minor through a different route than usual by completing the following courses.

Intensive Summer Program 15-GRMN-161-301	3 cr. toward minor	This class provides two years of college language instruction and meets the basic language requirement for a German minor.
German Language/Culture I for ICP 15-GRMN-364	3	Fall quarter, following the intensive summer class.
German Language/Culture II for ICP 15-GRMN-365	9	 This class includes: Winter quarter, following German 364: 30 classroom hours of instruction. Spring quarter, following winter: 60 classroom hours of instruction, held over a two-week period in Köln, Germany.
Individual Projects 15-GRMN-499	6	 Living in Germany for two co-op quarters and completing the following assignments: A one-page list of German and English technical terms learned/used overseas An eight-page paper, written in German, describing experiences overseas and the work/project completed on co-op. Ideas for the paper include: * An overview of the history/development of your company in Germany * The role your company played in German industry * A report of your role and the project completed on your overseas co-op * General observations on your experience overseas (work and other) Students will work with the Undergraduate Advisor in the German Department, and must obtain approval for their proposal before beginning the assignment.
German Culture Electives (2 courses)	6	Any course offered by the German Studies Department qualifies. This includes courses at all levels and those that offer instruction either in German or in English. Note: to fulfill both ICP and German minor requirements, students must choose courses from the list of ICP-approved options, available on the ICP website.
One additional advanced language course at the 300-level or above	3	It is suggested that this course be taken as soon as possible after returning from Germany, to achieve maximum benefit from language skills developed abroad. Eligible courses include: 301-2-3 (Intro to German Studies), 401-2-3 (Seminar in German Studies) and any 400-level literature/culture course in German. Only one course from any of these sequences is required, not the entire sequence.
