NURSING CURRICULUM & INFORMATION for A&S Exploratory Students & Families

UC's Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) major is a highly competitive, four-year degree program with limited seats that Exploratory students must compete to transition into. The BSN major is offered on the Uptown East (Clifton Medical) Campus. Exploratory students should strongly consider and work with their Exploratory advisor on a parallel plan to become a nurse if this is their true passion.

Transitioning students wishing to enter the BSN major must have a cumulative GPA of <u>at least 2.5 to be considered for</u> <u>admission</u>. However, students must earn <u>a minimum GPA of 3.0 in the pre-requisite nursing courses</u> listed below to be considered for admission. It is also possible to complete these courses as any major through the College of Arts and Sciences, Blue Ash College, Clermont College or another University and apply to the BSN major. Note: although the pre-requisite nursing courses GPA of 3.0 is required to be considered for admission, the actual competitive GPA in these courses is typically much higher.

The following courses are <u>required</u> to be completed by the end of the spring semester to be considered for admission into the BSN major sophomore year. Some courses may be moved from fall to spring semester; these courses are marked with an asterisk (*).

Admission to the College of Nursing, BSN major sophomore Year

- Completion of minimum requirements does NOT assure admission.
- Students must complete ALL pre-requisite courses by the end of the <u>SPRING</u> semester with a <u>minimum</u> GPA of 3.0 in these courses to be considered for admission. But keep in mind, the average competitive GPA in pre-requisite nursing courses has typically been much higher.
- NO grades below a C in any freshman course will be accepted. Even a C- is not acceptable.
- Repeated grades are averaged, with the exception of Humanities or Fine Arts (HU and FA) courses, in which case the highest grade is used.
- Exploratory students must take and use any 2 cr. hrs. of college-level course(s) by the end of the spring semester of their freshman year to make-up for the 2 cr. hr. "Success in College & Nursing" course first year nursing students in the College of Nursing take. (Exploratory students are prevented from registering for this course.)
- The College of Nursing will present more specific information about the application process to apply to transition into the BSN major during an information session in November.
- To be considered, students should apply during the one-month application period February 1 28. The BSN application is an on-line application found at <u>www.nursing.uc.edu</u> during this one-month period of time.
- Exploratory students will also sign up for a date to go to Procter Hall (Uptown <u>East</u> Campus) to complete an essay and a pre-admissions exam (the HESI-A2) as part of the BSN application process. The exam covers anatomy and physiology, critical thinking, reading comprehension and math. Admission decisions are based on GPA (40%), the essay (30%), and the exam (30%).

We are NOT trying to suggest that you are in any danger of not getting into the nursing program. But we want to encourage you to develop a contingency plan so that whatever comes your way, you will have done some advanced preparation. Regardless of the circumstances, contingency planning (or "Parallel Planning") is one of the hallmarks of a professional.

Parallel Plan Options

Program Options at the University of Cincinnati to Become a Nurse

1. Nursing, RN Technology

While applying to the UC BSN program, you can simultaneously apply to the RN program at Blue Ash. For more information please visit their website <u>UC-Blue Ash</u> and attend an information session. You will need to RSVP for a specific date and time at <u>UC Blue Ash Group Advising Sessions</u>. Call (513) 745-5753 with questions. After completing your RN you can consider Option #2 below.

2. <u>RN to BSN</u>

After earning your RN (see option #1 above & several options below), you can come to the University of Cincinnati and complete the <u>RN to BSN Completion Program</u>. After one year full-time you will have earned a BSN. Attend an information session to learn more; they are offered monthly. The information session has also been recorded and posted on their website.

3. Accelerated Pathway Program

Consider choosing a different major and applying to the <u>Accelerated Pathway Program</u> in the College of Nursing once you have earned your Bachelor's degree. Information sessions are offered every other month; dates and times are listed on the website. The information session has also been recorded and posted on their website.
