Transfer Students

Apply online at admissions.uc.edu/apply Send official college transcripts to the Office of Admissions

Send official high school transcripts if:

You have earned less than 30 semester hours or 45 quarter hours You are applying to Architecture or Interior Design and you have not completed the requisite math and physics courses in college

UC Students

Submit the "Application for Change in College" form to the DAAP Student Affairs Office, 5470 Aronoff

Complete a Personal Statement (optional)

Must be typed on a separate sheet of paper; one page or less

Deadlines

Fall Semester: March 1st

Priority for all programs (late applications will be reviewed on a space-available basis)

Spring Semester: November 1st

Summer Semester: March 1st

Requirements

School of Design

Minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA

Communication Design, Fashion Design, and Industrial Design

School of Architecture and Interior Design

Minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA

Architecture and Interior Design*

*If the student lacks the math and physics requirements from high school, then the student should complete an appropriate college level course. High School Requirement: 4 units of college prep math, including 1 unit of pre-calculus, calculus, or advanced math (trigonometry), and 1 unit of physics; OR College Requirement: MATH1022, 1024, 1026, 1044, 1060, or 1061; PHYS1011, 1017, 1018, 1037, 1051, or 2001 or equivalent course

School of Art

Minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA

Art History and Fine Arts

School of Planning

Horticulture

Minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA or 2.0 cumulative GPA w/ associate's degree

Urban Planning and Urban Studies

Minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA



Key Points

Admission is not guaranteed even if the GPA minimum requirement is met. It is impossible to predict what credentials a student will need to transfer/transition into DAAP, due to the size and quality of the applicant pool varying from year to year.

In addition to the cumulative university GPA (all college-level credit), DAAP reviews grades earned in each class, number of hours carried, and the rigor of the courses. English proficiency and math preparation may also be taken into consideration. For students with less than 30 semester/45 quarter hours earned, DAAP may review the high school GPA, class rank, coursework completed, and/or test scores.

DAAP only reviews portfolios for Fine Arts. Recommendation letters are not considered.

Students are typically admitted to the first year of our studio-based, co-op programs. If admitted, you will need a full 4 (Architecture) or 5 years (all Design programs, Fine Arts**, and Urban Planning) to complete your degree. **It may be possible to complete the Fine Arts program in 4 years.

Transition Students: If applying to more than one program submit a separate "Application for Change in College" form and personal statement for each major. Rank preferences on each application. Limit 3 applications.

Transfer Students: To view an evaluation of transferable credits before applying use transferology.com. This is a free tool that allows students to view a potential credit evaluation.

Readmit Students: Former UC students seeking readmission must submit an "Application for Readmission" form first before reviewing previous credits. May be eligible to begin in spring or summer. Contact the DAAP Student Affairs Office for more information.
