

Transitioning to the Carl H. Lindner College of Business

Students are encouraged to attend a Lindner Transition Info Session to learn more about the curriculum, admissions requirements and the process of transition. You must RSVP by calling Lindner at **513-556-7030** or visiting them in 105 Lindner Hall. Dates, times, and locations are determined by the college.

Students entering Exploratory Studies directly out of high school should anticipate spending their full first year as Exploratory students taking a "pre-business" curriculum.

Admission Policy as of May 2018. Lindner reserves the right to adjust this policy.

Submission Deadlines:

Nov 1st - Spring Semester

March 1st - Summer Semester

July 1st - Fall Semester

Required Steps to Transition:

- 1) Complete an "Application for Change in College and Program" form available via http://www.uc.edu/content/dam/uc/registrar/docs/change_in_college_application.pdf.
- 2) Earn at least a **2.5 Net GPA** (this includes grades at other post-secondary schools). Maintain a 2.0 UC University GPA.
- 3) Complete the Math course that is required for admission to your preferred program during the semester before you wish to apply:

BBA and BA-ECON Degrees	
31 or more credit hours	MATH 1044 (3 cr. hrs) – Applied Calculus I (C- or better) or MATH 1061 (4 cr. hrs) – Calculus I (C- or better) or MATH 1046 (5 cr. hrs) – Business Calculus (D- or better)
30 credit hours	MATH 1021 (3 cr. hrs) - College Algebra (C- or better), or any of the above courses

BANA – BS and BSIM Degrees	
30 or more credit hours	MATH 1061 (4 cr. hrs) – Calculus I (C- or better)

Note: Many students in BA ECON prefer to take the Calculus I, II sequence - Math 1061 and 1062 (8) as preparation for additional ambitions in quantitative disciplines such as math, statistics, and business analytics.

4) We will make admissions decisions based upon student's net GPAs at the time of review. Students who have incomplete grades posted on their transcripts will have their GPA calculated with zero quality points for the incomplete. Students must have file grade replacement forms prior to application; students who file grade replacement forms after the decision will be considered for admission the following semester.

5) Students will be notified of admission decisions via their UC email in a timely fashion. Admitted students must RSVP and attend an Orientation session to confirm admission. Students will be given permission to add upper tier Lindner courses at Orientation. **Your admission will be revoked if you do not attend the Orientation session.**

Co-op/Internships/Experiential Learning:

Lindner students pursue Professional Experiences (including Co-op, internship, and part-time opportunities) with the Lindner Career Services team. Transition students register for Career Success Strategies - BA 2080 (1) to learn more about possible co-op, internship and part-time opportunities that will fit their particular professional experiential goals at Orientation.

Students who are enrolled in a 4-year degree program may consider adding one of these minors to their academic major. A 3.0 UC GPA is required for students who are not enrolled in the Lindner College of Business to add all of these minors, with the exception of the Professional Sales minor. In addition to the discipline-specific minors, non-Lindner students are eligible to pursue the minor in Business Administration:

- It provides a selection of courses in the business functional areas that will add a business background to other degrees with other career goals
- Requires 2.0 UC GPA
- 50% of the courses must be taken in Lindner

If you are pursuing a BBA degree in Lindner, most Lindner minors only require 12 additional credit hours, and pursuing a double major in another Lindner BBA program usually requires 18 additional credit hours
