From first-year composition through senior capstone courses, English students engage with a wide range of historical and contemporary texts and subject matter, including global, ethnic, and minority literatures; film and visual media; and scientific and professional writing. Three (3) Tracks Offered:

Literary & Cultural Studies — "enables students to hone their skills as readers of literary and cultural texts, and as writers practicing literary interpretation and cultural criticism by studying texts from different time periods, produced in varied media and genres, and relating to diverse national, cultural, ethnic, and minority communities and traditions."
