Interdisciplinary Nursing Preparation offers students the opportunity to focus on their true passion for nursing while being challenged to understand that collaboration between professionals starts with interdisciplinary education. This partnership between Cincinnati Arts and Sciences and Cincinnati College of Nursing is a direct response to the demand for universities and training programs to expand interdisciplinary educational opportunities and programs to help foster collaboration among students before they enter the health workforce. Through this program, students get expert advising, additional nursing courses and an interdisciplinary experience that prepares them to apply to the Accelerated Direct-Entry Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) program, designed specifically for students who hold a degree and want to be an RN.* Includes prerequisites.
