Professor Lewis's research interests live at the intersection of law and politics in America, and he is particularly interested in legal advocacy, rights politics, First Amendment law, religious political behavior, and the engagement of religious groups in politics and law. Professor Lewis's research has appeared in The New York Times and many social science journals, and his award-winning book The Rights Turn in Conservative Christian Politics: How Abortion Transformed the Culture Wars (Cambridge University Press) was published in 2017.

In addition, students may participate in a small number of internships at College of Law legal clinics, which could include Ohio Innocence Project, Entrepreneurship and Community Development Clinic, ad Civil Protection Order Clinic.
