Psychology is the scientific study of the behavior of humans and other animals. Psychology majors develop strong research and analytical skills while exploring all phases of human life. Students of psychology are interested in conducting research to discover patterns of human behavior, as well as in applying psychological principles and techniques to solving social and individual problems.

Bachelor of Arts (BA) and Bachelor of Science (BS) degrees offered. What's the difference?

The BA may be more appropriate if you want to go directly into the workforce upon graduation or go on to graduate school and work as a therapist, school counselor, or focus on industrial, organizational or developmental psychology's applications.

The BS may be more appropriate if you intend to study neuroscience and behavior, or are interested in becoming a, psychiatrist or any medical aspect of psychology. It is also designed for students interested in pursuing a PhD degree and doing research.
